In the past year, our efforts centered on offering clients a range of Indigenous support services, including cultural programs, Traditional Healing, Indigenous perinatal mental health services, doula support, massage therapy, and diabetes foot care. Additionally, our Strong Women Strong Nation program made significant strides in connecting with Indigenous organizations in North Simcoe Muskoka. The Biidaaban Doula Collective hosted a 'meet and greet' on Christian Island reaching out to new and expectant mothers. Collaborations were also established with the Beausoleil Family Health Centre and Beausoleil Day Care - further strengthening our community ties.

We honoured the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation** on September 30th with a
meaningful event at the Midland Community Health
Hub, including a sacred fire and strong community
participation.

Chigamik was also pleased to be designated as a Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario (RNAO) Best Practice Spotlight Organization (BPSO) – Indigenous Focused, after nearly four years of dedicated planning and implementation. This accomplishment underscores our commitment to evidence-based practices and exceptional quality standards. We extend heartfelt thanks to our staff and implementation leads for their unwavering dedication, as they continue to guide the seamless integration of Best Practice Guidelines into our daily operations at Chigamik.



Chigamik received the RNAO BPSO - Indigenous Focused designation and was recognized at the RNAO Annual General Meeting.

FRANCOPHONE SERVICES & PROGRAMS

Over the past year, Chigamik partnered with local organizations like Le Villageois de Lafontaine, the Alzheimer Society of Simcoe, and Service Canada, to improve access to French healthcare services and community programs. We celebrated Franco-Ontarian Day by joining the 30 Days of Culture initiative, offering numerous French-language activities in collaboration with the Cultural Alliance. Additionally, we provided 103 community workshops and programs in French throughout the year, including our ongoing Mindful Mondays workshops and Grouille ou Rouille exercise program.

This initiative strengthens the link between social and clinical care, a vital part of our holistic healthcare approach. Our objective is to help individuals facing challenges such as loneliness, isolation, mental health issues, and chronic illnesses. We strive to enhance overall health and wellbeing by leveraging our clients' unique skills, gifts, and interests to connect them with local and non-clinical services. Our ultimate goal is to provide clients with purpose, a sense of belonging, and community connection, while improving their mental and physical wellbeing.

NORTH SIMCOE ONTARIO HEALTH TEAM

Over the past year, the North Simcoe Ontario Health Team (NSOHT) has been working towards establishing a cohesive health and social care network that centres around the unique needs of our local community. As a core partner of the NSOHT, Chigamik played a pivotal role in shaping the NSOHT's strategic plan and leadership direction. Our primary focus was on community-driven projects, including advancements in digital healthcare and enhancing access to healthcare services, particularly for vulnerable individuals lacking a primary care provider.
