INDIGENOUS SERVICES & PROGRAMS

In the past year, we have focused on forging new partnerships and expanding our Indigenous support services to better meet the needs of our clients and community. We have enriched our offerings with a diverse range of cultural programs, Indigenous perinatal mental health services, doula support, massage therapy, and diabetes foot care. Our Strong Women Strong Nation program has been particularly impactful, fostering deep connections with Indigenous families across North Simcoe Muskoka, enhanced by the collaborative efforts of the Biidaaban Doula Collective.

On September 30th, our community came together to honour the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. We hosted a series of events to commemorate this significant day and to celebrate Indigenous culture through music, art, and dance.



FRANCOPHONE SERVICES & PROGRAMS



In the past year, Chigamik has collaborated with local partners, including Le Villageois de Lafontaine, Entité 4 and the Canadian Mental Health Association, to improve access to French healthcare services and community programs. In 2023-2024, we delivered 103 community workshops and programs in French, including our ongoing initiatives such as our Vivre l'instant présent workshops and the Grouille ou Rouille exercise program.

We are also excited to announce our involvement in an inter-provincial partnership dedicated to supporting la Francophonie in Ontario. This partnership, supported by a funding alliance between Secrétariat du Québec aux relations canadiennes (SQRC) Quebec and the Office of Francophone Affairs in Ontario, will foster the creation of innovative programs for Franco-Ontarians, leveraging dance and the arts to promote wellbeing.

BUILDING A STRONG, COLLABORATIVE COMMUNITY



SINGWELL

In partnership with the North Simcoe Ontario Health Team, CHIGAMIK's SingWell program helps individuals with respiratory challenges improve their health and social connections through group singing.

PAP-A-PALOOZA

This cervical cancer screening event, in partnership with the Midland Midwives, Mamaway, and RVH Simcoe Muskoka Regional Cancer Centre, provided Pap tests, refreshments, and valuable information to attendees.



QUIT CAFÉ

CHIGAMIK's Quit Café program provided support and resources to individuals seeking to quit smoking, offering a welcoming space for participants to connect with others, receive free nicotine replacement therapy and guidance on their journey to a smoke-free life.



FALLS PREVENTION

The Safe Strides event, with our community partners, focused on fall prevention through functional screenings to assess physical capacity and fall risk. Attendees received risk assessments, guest speakers, exercise demos, and local support resources.



WINTER WELLNESS POP-UP

The Winter Wellness Pop-Up Market provided blankets, hats, mitts, personal care items, essential vitamins, and first aid necessities to those facing challenges in our community.

CELEBRATING ONE YEAR OF SOCIAL PRESCRIBING

CHIGAMIK proudly marked the first anniversary of its social prescribing program, which **connected over 300** clients to programs like exercise, art, and social activities, enhancing their mental, physical, and social well-being. Since its launch in 2023, the program fostered community connections, reduced loneliness, and supported initiatives such as the Quest Art Program, Women's Wellness Group, Good Food Box partnership, Winter Wellness Market, Fitness for Wellness, the Social Engagement Club, Phone Lending Program and more.
